Special Instructions

- 1. Do not rub the eye
- 2. Do not lift anything heavy
- 3. Do not wear eye make up / aftershave
- 4. Do not bend excessively
- 5. Use your drops as per discharge notification
- 6. If you do run out of your eye drops, please go to GP for another prescription
- 7. If your eyelids look or feel sticky, clean your eye using cool boiled water with cotton pads, before putting in your eye drops.
- 8. For Corneal rings and Corneal Cross Linking, we expect you to experience pain after surgery and temporary blurred vision for a couple of days. Please take regular pain relief. If pain or vision worsens, contact the clinic immediately.

Please do not drive to your follow up clinic visit as your eyes may be dilated.

Other important information

- 1. Wear your eye shield at night for 2 weeks. Please be aware that you need to buy surgical tape to secure the shield. This will not be provided by the hospital.
- 2. Wash your hands and keep all things used for your eye extra clean.
- 3. On removing the eye shield wash in soapy water, keep it in a dry and clean place.
- 4. Do wash your hair backwards rather than forwards.
- 5. Do gently carry on with your daily activities.
- 6. Any change in eye condition as indicated on the RSVP page, please contact the ward immediately.

HOW TO USE YOUR EYE

MEDICATION

DROPS:

- IN ORDER TO KEEP THE EYE DROPS CLEAN, DO NOT ALLOW THE DROPPER TIP TO TOUCH THE EYE OR ANYTHING ELSE.
- DO NOT ALLOW OTHER PEOPLE TO USE YOUR EYE DROPS.
- DISCARD EYE DROPS AFTER ONE MONTH.

APPLICATION:



- WASH YOUR HANDS.
- SIT OR LIE COMFORTABLY WITH HEAD TILTED BACKWARDS, LOOKING AT THE CEILING.
- GENTLY PULL DOWN THE LOWER LID WITH ONE FINGER TO FORM A SAC.
- HOLDING THE EYE DROPS IN YOUR OTHER HAND, BRING THE DROPPER CLOSE TO THE EYE AND SQUEEZE ONE DROP INTO THE SAC.
- CLOSE THE EYE AND BLOT EXCESS SOLUTION WITH A CLEAN TISSUE.
- REPLACE THE CAP OF THE EYE DROPS IMMEDIATELY AFTER USE.

OINTMENT:

- A SMALL AMOUNT OF OINTMENT SHOULD BE SQUEEZED OUT AND DISCARDED IMMEDIATELY BEFORE EVERY APPLICATION TO ENSURE STERILITY.
- DISCARD EYE OINTMENT AFTER ONE MONTH.

APPLICATION:



- WITH HEAD IN FAIRLY UPRIGHT POSITION, GENTLY PULL DOWN THE LOWER LID WITH ONE FINGER TO FORM A SAC.
- SQUEEZE A HALF INCH RIBBON OF OINTMENT INTO THE SAC FORMED.

CLOSE EYE FOR 5 MINUTES BY THE CLOCK BETWEEN EACH DROP
