Looking after your wound after surgery

- It is very important that you **DO NOT** remove the dressing that has been applied as you have an open wound underneath.
- During the next 24 hours, once the local anaesthetic has worn off, there may be some discomfort. You can take paracetamol to relieve this. It is very important that you follow the dosage instructions and that these painkillers **DO NOT** contain aspirin as there is a chance this could increase the risk of bleeding.
- When surgery is performed on the head or neck area, please try not to bend down for 24 to 48 hours as this can cause pressure on the wound and will increase the risk of bleeding.
- If bleeding does occur, apply continuous firm pressure with a clean pad or handkerchief directly on the wound for 10 minutes. Repeat as necessary.
