## **Dementia Support Services** Information for patients and carers

#### Introduction

This information leaflet directs patients, relatives and their carers to support services for people with dementia. The services have been identified as either, local to Queen Victoria Hospital NHS Foundation Trust (QVH) and the surrounding healthcare community, or as national information services.

## Local dementia support services

#### QVH

- **Butterfly Scheme** The QVH has implemented the Butterfly Scheme which was devised by a carer whose mother had dementia: its purpose is to improve patient safety and well-being in hospitals. The scheme enables staff to respond appropriately and positively not only to people with dementia but also to those with memory-impairment or temporary confusion and allows people to request that response via a discreet Butterfly symbol.
- **Dementia Care Champions** Each department has a dementia champion who will direct and advise patients and carer's on the Butterfly Scheme ensuring the patient's experience is a positive one.

- Community groups, such as swimming, walking, Zumba, tai chi, board games and cinema
- Help at Home domestic service for help with cleaning, ironing and shopping
- Respite service for carers which provides specialist support for people who are more frail or who have low-level dementia on 1st/3rd Saturdays of the month and late afternoon on last Monday of month.
- Access to all services can be by personal referral and do not need assessment by Social Services. Some services are funded but there is a charge for others. Transport is available through a local provider.

  - Carers Support Groups run by AS where the cared for are looked after for a small charge whilst the carer has time to listen to a speaker on a relevant topic and share experiences with others caring for and living with dementia
  - Training courses for carers.
  - **'Dementia Friends'** any member of the public can sign up to become either a **Dementia Champion** or a **Dementia Friend.** Training is provided. The objective is to encourage the development of dementia-friendly communities: at home, in the workplace etc. Training is provided for those signing up.
