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How to refer to QVH

GP referrals to Consultant-led services must be made via the Electronic Referral System (eRS). As a specialist centre we receive many referrals from other hospitals (tertiary referrals) these are not affected by this scheme. Likewise if the service is a nurse-led clinic, therapy session, GDP referral or a prisoner referral, eRS does not apply.

Burns

The QVH Burns Unit is a key member of the South East Burns Network which covers Kent, Surrey, Sussex and parts of South London. It provides care for adults and children, depending on severity.

In addition, we provide an outpatient clinic, physiotherapy, occupational therapy and psychological support, rehabilitation for patients recovering from major burns injuries and reconstruction clinics to review healed burns.

The QVH Outreach Burns Service provides specialist care for those patients within the region that cannot be transferred to the Burns Unit, or for those with smaller burns who can be managed as outpatients nearer to their homes. In addition we have established burns clinics in Brighton and plan to establish more in other parts of the region.

The burns team prefer healthcare professionals to contact them directly by telephone (01342 414440 for adults and 01342 414469 for children) for advice and to speed up the referral of any acute or chronic burn injury for review.

Patients with burn scars that impair function or are symptomatic can be referred into the adult or paediatric burn reconstruction clinic by referral letter or using NHS e-Referrals.

This multi-disciplinary team is led by two consultant plastic surgeons and includes a consultant maxillofacial surgeon, consultant oculo-plastic surgeon, psychological therapists and specialist physiotherapist and speech and language therapists. Together they use new techniques and expertise to re-animate the face which are more effective than traditional methods.

Hand surgery

The hand surgery service provided by QVH is recognised, both regionally and nationally, for its excellent high quality service covering a range of elective conditions as well as trauma. It includes consultants with specific interests in congenital hand anomalies:

- rheumatoid and osteoarthritis
- · wrist surgery for arthritis
- instability
- · compression neuropathies
- · post-trauma reconstruction.

We offer, where appropriate, non-operative and minimally invasive treatment alternatives such as:

- wrist arthroscopy
- needle aponeurotomy (fasciotomy)
- Xiapex service for Dupuytren's contracture and endoscopic carpal tunnel release.

We are continuously available to manage soft tissue and bony trauma and to provide advice on other urgent problems including tendon ruptures, infections, extravasation injuries and pain syndromes.

Lower limb and general plastics

Our large team treat the full range of leg and general trauma conditions requiring plastic surgery, including scarring and acute and secondary reconstruction in upper and lower limbs.

As part of the lower limb service we also specialise in the management of amputation and the secondary surgery of amputation stumps/residual limbs to aid in comfortable prosthetic use. Our patients are both military and civilian and we have close links with civilian regional limb fitting services.

Supporting the service, our Trauma Outreach Team provides integrated and individualised care to vulnerable patients who are referred by other hospitals around the region for specialist plastic surgery.

A community based nurse practitioner specialising in tissue viability and wound healing assesses patients in their own home to arrange the specialist treatment they need, and supports local community nurses in their continuing care.

Using the hospital's telemedicine system, each patient is reviewed carefully by consultant plastic surgeons and admission arranged if surgery is the best course of action.

Skin Cancer

We are the largest provider of skin surgery services in the south east, caring for patients with lumps and bumps, moles, sun damage and skin cancers. Our team has a high level of experience and expertise, treating over 3,000 patients every year.

Our Melanoma and Skin Cancer Unit is the only one in the region providing the complete range of specialist skin cancer services including medical treatments with immunotherapy, cryotherapy, curettage, sentinel node biopsy, simple excisions, skin grafting, local flaps, CO2 laser treatment, Mohs and PDT service and the complex management of metastatic disease. It is the designated tertiary referral centre for all skin cancers across the region and is recognised by the Kent, Sussex and Surrey Cancer Networks.

QVH offers a regional Mohs Micrographic Service for removing high risk basal cell carcinomas (BCC) from the head and neck. This procedure involves a local anaesthetic to remove the BCC, which is then frozen and analysed during the procedure by Dr Bav Shergill (Mohs practitioner). Once the BCC has been cleared a member of the QVH surgeons will undertake the reconstruction within a few days. Patients will be seen and discussed at the specialist skin cancer multidisciplinary meeting hosted in Brighton. Once the case has been assessed, the service will make all the necessary arrangements for patients to be treated at our hospital if appropriate.

We offer a teledermatology service for patients that have been referred on a 2ww pathway to have their lesions imaged by a medical photographer. From there a consultant plastic surgeon/dermatologist will review and create a treatment plan. We are working to expand this service to our routine and urgent pathways for skinrelated concerns.

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Head, neck, eyes, dental

QVH head and neck services are recognised, regionally and nationally, for the specialist expertise offered by our large consultant body. In particular, QVH is the Kent and Sussex surgical centre for head and neck cancer and is recognised by the Royal College of Surgeons as a training centre for head and neck surgical fellows.

QVH also has the largest maxillofacial and head & neck prosthetics laboratory in the NHS which provides a wide range of support to orthodontists and to maxillofacial, ophthalmic, neuro and plastic surgeons.

The QVH corneoplastic unit and eye bank is a high-profile and technologically advanced specialist and tertiary referral centre for complex corneal problems and oculoplastics.

Corneoplastics and ophthalmology

The QVH corneoplastic unit and eye bank is a highprofile and technologically advanced specialist and tertiary referral centre for complex corneal problems and oculoplastics. The Corneoplastic Unit & Eye Bank at QVH has expanded services over the last few years and provide:

Cataract surgery - modern small incision cataract surgery with availability for advanced toric correction of astigmatism with added value toric lenses. The unit takes referrals for expert opinion from all over the UK for complex cataract surgery and anterior segment reconstruction.

Glaucoma - QVH offers a fully comprehensive Glaucoma service run by Mr Gokulan Ratnarajan. The service has 3 new lasers that offer glaucoma patients safe alternatives to eye drops. QVH is a centre of excellence and innovation for glaucoma surgery including the most recent MIGS (Minimally Invasive Glaucoma Surgery), Trabeculectomy and Glaucoma Drainage Devices.

Cornea transplantation - QVH has been at the forefront of advances in Cornea transplantation over the last 60 years. Services include Lamellar transplantation (DALK,DSAEK,DMEK), Laser assisted transplantation, stem cell transplants, Dry eye treatments including plasma eye drops production (National referral centre), reconstruction after burns and trauma.

Also, advanced treatments for keratoconus such as Collagen cross linking (National referral centre), Intracorneal ring segments with femtosecond laser (Intacs, Kerarings), Phakic toric intraocular Lenses. This is supported by the Queen Victoria Hospital Eye Bank.

Oculoplastic surgery - specialist techniques in oculoplastic surgery including Mohs micrographic excision for eyelid tumour management; facial palsy rehabilitation; endoscopic DCR and modern orbital decompression techniques for thyroid eye disease.

Dry eye service - QVH has also developed a dry eye service for local people. Our specialist nurse-led clinic is for people with severe dry eye conditions including Sjorgrens syndrome and Blepharitis. Referrals are welcomed from GPs or eye specialists.

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Head and neck oncology

We are a regional centre for head and neck surgery. Our services include primary assessment and diagnosis, specialist review, surgery and follow up. The team includes maxillofacial and ENT surgeons, all with sub-specialty experience in tumours of the mouth, throat, neck and head.

Both routine and advanced surgery is carried out, including laser surgery, sentinel lymph node biopsy, advanced reconstructive techniques and electro chemotherapy. This includes routine tongue cancer ablation and simple free tissue transfer to complex facial or laryngopharyngeal ablation requiring advanced complex free tissue transfer.

The multidisciplinary team meet weekly with other local ENT surgeons, oncologists, speech and language therapists, dietitians and specialist nurses to offer coordinated state-of-the-art care to both inpatients and outpatients.



Sleep Disorder Centre

The QVH Sleep Disorder Centre was founded in 1992. The centre employs 33 staff and sees over 7,000 patients each year.

Referrals are accepted from a wide area including the whole of the South East England.

Its core work comprises adults with sleep disordered breathing at night, with 14,000 patients successfully treated with CPAP and non-invasive ventilation. It also treats movement disorders in sleep including:

- restless leg syndrome,
- movement disorders in sleep
- REM behaviour disorders
- narcolepsy
- · circadian rhythm disorder.

Insomnia clinics are also available working closely with the Psychological Therapy team to offer CBT and other specialist therapies.

Burns and plastics therapy

The QVH burns, plastics and head and neck team consist of ten experienced and specialist staff including four Chartered Physiotherapists, three occupational therapists, three rehabilitation assistants/garment technicians. We offer a comprehensive inpatient service to adults and paediatric patients within QVH following burns, plastics and head and neck surgeries.

These include:

- Respiratory physiotherapy
- Function and mobility and assessments
- Activity of daily living assessments
- Musculoskeletal assessment
- Paediatric therapy
- Specialist rehabilitation post surgery
- Specialist burns and major loss rehabilitation.

We also provide outpatients services to adults and paediatric burns patients, includes:

- Specialist weekly scar management clinics for paediatrics and adults
- Joint clinics with burns consultant including steroid injections
- Onsite pressure garment service
- Intensive burns and major tissue loss rehabilitation

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Musculoskeletal physiotherapy

The QVH musculoskeletal outpatient team consists of ten experienced chartered physiotherapists who specialise in the detailed assessment and management of musculoskeletal problems, including:

- · Spinal problems
- · Upper and lower limb problems
- · Trauma and elective surgery
- Fractures
- Sports injuries
- Cervical headaches
- Dizziness
- Rheumatological conditions
- Women's Health conditions
- Pelvic health conditions

Treatment plans are based on comprehensive ongoing assessment and may include one or more of the following: manual therapy; exercise therapy; electrotherapy; taping; clinical Pilates; comprehensive education as well as adjuncts to treatment such as acupuncture. In addition to one-to-one treatment sessions, we run a lower limb rehabilitation exercise class a Back In Control (BIC) programme (for chronic back and neck pain) an OA hip and knee class and a shoulder class.

We have a pelvic and women's health physiotherapist with membership to the clinical special interest group of Pelvic, Obstetric, Gynaecology Physiotherapists (POGP). They specialise in the detailed assessment and treatment of pregnancy related musculoskeletal and continence problems as well as adult bladder and bowel problems. Treatment may include manual therapy,

exercise therapy including pelvic floor and sphincter exercises, functional and birth advice as well as bladder and bowel re-education. We also have a biofeedback machine and real time ultrasound scanner to assist with pelvic floor muscle strengthening and feedback.

Psychological therapy

The Department of Psychological Therapies offers a range of evidence-based psychological treatments to patients at QVH. The department is made up of seven Clinical Psychologists and Psychotherapists and a specialist Paediatric Clinical Psychologist. We offer support to patients with burns injuries, facial palsy and facial anomalies, chronic illness, Cancer, accidents and injuries requiring surgery. Treatments include Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Eye Movement Desensitisation Reprocessing (EMDR), Mindfulness and Brief Solution-Focused Therapy (BSFT). We offer several therapy groups including the Mindfulness group and CBT for insomnia.

The service specialises in supporting people with body image difficulties following illness of injury, post-traumatic stress, injury/illness-related depression and anxiety, insomnia and other sleep disorders such as nightmares. Inpatients can be seen by therapists before and after procedures to help with preparing them for surgery and for adjusting following surgery.

Speech and language therapy

The QVH speech and language therapy service provides highly specialist assessment, diagnosis and treatment of a wide range of communication and swallowing disorders to inpatients and outpatients with medical conditions such as neurological illness, head and neck cancer, burns and ear nose and throat disorders. A videoflurosocopy service is available weekly, using dynamic x-ray films to assess and manage problems arising with eating and drinking. The team also offers a comprehensive community service for neurological conditions.

Community Rehabilitation

We provide physiotherapy and occupational therapy service to adults in our local community and receive a variety of referrals for orthopaedic, neurological and deteriorating conditions and falls. Assessments can be carried out at home or in the rehabilitation unit by an occupational therapist, physiotherapist or both as appropriate. Following assessments and alongside discussion with patients, treatment plans are set and are under constant review as needs change.

Treatment can be individual, group or both, dependent on assessment.

We run a balance and bones group which is based according to patient's needs and ability.

Working within the same building as dieticians, speech and language therapists, a Parkinson's disease nurse specialist and orthotics allows for easy referral of our patients to other professionals. For those with chronic conditions they are able to self refer to the team and the same therapist, which allows for seamless personal care.

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

Anaesthetics

The anaesthetic department at QVH includes 23 consultant anaesthetists, 5 associate and trust grade specialists and 8 senior anaesthetic trainees with responsibilities to patients before, during and after surgery.

The team provides preoperative assessment, anaesthesia, pain and critical care services for all our specialist services.

We specialise in the difficult airway, regional anaesthesia, and total intravenous anaesthesia. We promote green anaesthesia and are the first to cease using the most environmentally harmful anaesthetics in the country. Our patient recovery profiles are amongst the best nationally and this helps our surgical patients to be the most satisfied in the NHS annual surveys.

Out anaesthetic training for junior doctors is acknowledged to be first class in all recent GMC surveys and is a reflection of the all-around good care we give to our patients.

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Surgical appliances (orthotics)

QVH provides an orthotic outpatient clinic where people are assessed by specialist staff for the provision of orthoses (appliances).

We provide a comprehensive service to aid movement, correct deformity and relieve discomfort. An orthoses is externally and directly fitted to the body to support, align, prevent, correct, compensate or accommodate for physical deformity/weakness, skeletal, muscular or neuromuscular abnormalities and improve movement in parts of the body. They are designed to remedy or relieve a medical condition or disability and it may prevent the development of more disabiling conditions. Treatments provided include:

- CAD CAM custom-made insoles and stock insoles.
- Orthopaedic footwear, stock, modular and made to measure
- Footwear adaptions
- · Ankle foot orthoses (AFOs) stock and made to measure
- Knee bracing stock and made to measure
- Knee ankle foot Orthoses (KAFOs)
- Stance control KAFOs
- Spinal orthoses
- Neck orthoses
- Head protection
- Post-operative bracing.

We also supply a range of breast prosthesis. Patients are referred directly to the service by their hospital consultant, specialist team, treating clinician, allied health professional or GP.

Diagnostic imaging

QVH provides a comprehensive range of diagnostic imaging services for general practitioners and dentists, as well as support to the hospital's services.

Services include general/dental radiology, ultrasound, CT scanning, Cone Beam CT and MRI. Other specialist services include: salivary stone removal and joint injections done under ultrasound.

GPs and dentists can refer patients directly to QVH for imaging tests.

QVH is a designated Community Diagnostic Centre and this means that GPs are able to refer to the trust for CT/MRI/US and x-ray imaging. We use Electronic requesting from most GP practices but those who are paper based may send referrals by email to gvh.xray@nhs.net.

Paediatrics

QVH provides a 24/7 paediatric surgical and burns service for children from birth to 16 years. We have a nine-bed children's ward known as Peanut Ward. We admit children as day cases or in-patients (from 6 months old) for a wide range of operations, both planned and urgent.

Typical operations carried out under general anaesthetic are repairs to finger, hand and face injuries, eye surgery, corrections of congenital problems and treatment of burns. The team of nurses, surgeons, paediatricians, anaesthetists and other healthcare staff work closely together and are all specifically trained in the care of children.

The service is supported by general paediatric consultants from The Royal Alexandra Children's Hospital in Brighton with which QVH has a formal partnership. The consultant paediatricians providing support to the QVH site are led by Dr Geetha Fonseca and Dr Oli Rahman who also hold regular outpatient clinics at QVH for general medical paediatric referrals. Both hospitals work closely together and often share the care of patients.

For children needing surgery not offered at QVH, we host a fortnightly clinic for the general paediatric surgeons from Brighton.

Histopathology

QVH Histopathology's department provides services to the Trust and local GPs. The service has specialist expertise in dermatopathology, head and neck pathology and breast pathology, and provides support for intra-operative assessment including frozen sections and Mohs surgery. The consultant histopathologists attend skin, head and neck and breast multidisciplinary meetings as part of the clinical pathways in Kent, Surrey and Sussex.

The histopathology services have been granted accreditation by the United Kingdom Accreditation Service (UKAS) against the ISO 15189 standards for medical laboratories. The laboratory was the first histopathology laboratory in the UK to achieve this accreditation and remains at the forefront of continual quality committed to annual re-inspection to ensure we are providing the best possible service to our patients.

The department provides clinical advice and tissue diagnosis. GPs can refer samples directly to QVH for histopathology including skin and oral biopsies. We maintain the highest standards of diagnostic quality and turnaround times with performance well within the 10 day turnaround standard laid out by the Royal College of Pathologists.

Telemedicine

As the regional specialist centre for reconstructive surgery following trauma, we have developed and now have a well-established telemedicine referral system known as Telemedicine Referral Image Portal System (TRIPS). This allows photographs of injuries to be reviewed by qualified and experienced clinicians at any time of day or night, regardless of where in the region the patient is located.

In 2023 the TRIPS website received over 32,000 referrals. Images are received from more than 220 fixed locations in Accident & Emergency departments, Urgent Care Centres, Walk-In Centres, and Minor Injury Units to five hubs across the area covered by the London and South of England Burns Network. In addition, Paramedic Practitioner teams from the South East Coast Ambulance Service are able to send images and receive clinical advice from the scene of an incident. Primary care staff can also refer directly from the consulting room.

TRIPS provides a multi-centre referral system for burns, necrotising fasciitis, hand trauma, maxillofacial injuries, and lower leg trauma with five hubs across the South East of England.

The five hubs located in Broomfield Hospital, Chelmsford, Chelsea and Westminster Hospital, London, St Georges Hospital, Tooting, Stoke Mandeville Hospital in Aylesbury and Queen Victoria Hospital in East Grinstead, are all able to accept referral images from any PC connected to the NHS private network via the TRIPS website.

How to access this service

Clinicians wishing to make a referral will need access to a computer linked to the NHS private network (HSCN) and the ability to upload the images from a digital camera or memory card. In order to comply with information governance and GDPR rules and regulations, images should never be taken on a mobile phone or other mobile device unless it is owned by the NHS and encrypted. Images can be uploaded to the secure TRIPS website at https://www.trips.nhs.uk/

Instructions on how to use the site can be found on the <u>TRIPS website</u> by following the 'Help and Information' link located at the bottom right of each page.

Once the images have been uploaded referrals should be discussed with the appropriate hub. All contact numbers are available on the TRIPS website just click the Hub Contacts hyperlink found at the bottom of each page.

Prosthetics: Head, neck, eyes and dental

The prosthetics department at QVH is the largest of its kind in the UK. The team of maxillofacial prosthetists see and treat patients that require facial prostheses, artificial eyes, oral-maxillofacial devices (obturators) and body prostheses such as fingers and hands.

They also provide specialist head and neck splint devices, such as those required by patients with burn injuries.

Patients attend the Prosthetics Clinic for initial device planning, fabrication and fitting while continuing support and care is provided to all prosthetic patients that require it.

Medical photography

The QVH medical photography department sees more than 15,000 patients a year from both the hospital and community referrals.

Clinical photographs are taken to help doctors and other health professionals monitor various clinical conditions. They are also used as part of the planning process alongside other tests such as x-rays, scans and blood tests, or for educational purposes and publication if the right consent is received. Images can also be used for legal purposes to provide supporting evidence to a case.

Parkinson's disease nurse specialist

A Parkinson's Disease Nurse Specialist (PDNS) is based in the onsite Rehabilitation Unit and provides a comprehensive service for people with Parkinson's and related conditions (such as multiple system atrophy or progressive supranuclear palsy) who live in East Grinstead or Crawley.

The PDNS works closely with local neurologists and care of the elderly physicians. Nurse-led clinics are held at QVH and home visits are available to those who require it.

A joint Parkinson's clinic is held in the Rehabilitation Unit with the Care of the Elderly Physician and PDNS.

Patients need to be registered with an East Grinstead or Crawley GP. Referrals can be made directly to the PDNS by GPs and Consultants providing the person has a confirmed diagnosis of Parkinson's or a related condition.

Persons with a suspected diagnosis of Parkinson's should be referred quickly and untreated to a specialist with expertise in the differential diagnosis of this condition (NICE Guidelines for Management of Parkinson's disease 2006).

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Rheumatology

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Respiratory community outpatient service

QVH runs a consultant-led community respiratory service to give easy access and a comprehensive treatment. It encompasses:

Investigation of respiratory symptoms;

- cough
- wheeze
- breathlessness
- non-cardiac chest pain.

Investigation and management of common respiratory conditions:

- Asthma
- Bronchiectasis
- COPD
- Pulmonary Fibrosis
- Respiratory Infections
- Sarcoidosis.

The assessment of chest x-ray abnormalities *where* cancer is not suspected, and the assessment of abnormal GP spirometry results.

We also have access to a range of diagnostics such as CT/MRI, Spirometry, Lung function test as well as a guidance service for GP's via the NHS e-Referral Service (e-RS).

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Community Diagnostic Centre

The QVH Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC) offers a breathlessness pathway, physiological tests and imaging services to give easy access to primary care partners and local patients closer to their home.

We offer access to a range of diagnostics including; CT/MRI, spirometry, FeNO, phlebotomy and electrocardiography.

Vital tests such as this ensure patients receive assessments and diagnosis of their symptoms at the earliest opportunity to diagnose conditions and provide treatment plans for patients through easier, faster, and more direct access.

We are also developing additional pathways such as non-specific symptom (NSS).

In Sussex, there are currently five CDC's that offer vital tests, checks and scans, helping to speed up access to diagnostic services for all patients:

- Bexhill CDC
- Bognor Regis War Memorial Hospital CDC
- Brighton Diagnostic and Treatment Centre CDC
- Queen Victoria Hospital CDC
- Southlands Hospital CDC.
