	She thanked all those present for attending the Trust's AGM and stated that it is a chance for the Trust to reflect on the previous year and think about the future. She explained that there will be opportunities for members and members of public to ask questions throughout the meeting.

03-24	QVH review 2023/24 and plans for the year ahead JL presented a summary of the annual report and accounts 2023/24 (available in full on the Trust's website), plans for the year ahead and an update on the Trust's membership strategy.
	<ul> <li>Key highlights from the presentation included:</li> <li>Challenges- balancing the delivery of high quality care with rising demand and complexity; developing the Trust's organisational strategy; working in partnership and supporting patients to access services</li> <li>Operational performance- continued focus on reducing the back log during the year; 489 patients waiting more than 52 weeks for treatment; significant increases in referrals</li> <li>Successes- the CQC adult inpatient survey results published in 2023 showed that in questions about nurses and experience of leaving hospital QVH came top in the country; the NHS staff survey results published in 2024 showed that 76% of staff would recommend QVH as a place to work</li> <li>Finance- QVH achieved a breakeven position for 2023/24; total operating expenditure was £104.7m; £4.79m was invested in capital programme in year</li> <li>Board- JL has been CEO for one year; Russell Hobby, Shaun O'Leary and Peter O'Donnell joined the Board as Non-Executive Directors during the period; Kirsten Timmins joined the Board as Chief Operating Officer during the period; Helen Edmunds joined the Board as Chief People Officer during the period</li> <li>Membership- we value our public members as a way to hear feedback and keep our local communities informed; the Trust has over 7,000 public members; from tomorrow until 15 October, public members can put themselves forward to become one of our public governors</li> <li>Looking ahead- the Trust has submitted a breakeven plan for the next financial year</li> <li>The organisational strategy will be published in November 2024; work will continue on the East Grinstead Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC) and an Electronic Patient Record (EPR) system</li> </ul>
	JL extended thanks to all QVH staff and volunteers for their hard work during the year.
	The annual report and accounts 2023/24, update on the Trust's membership strategy and the update on the Trust's forward plan were <b>received.</b>
04-24	Summary of 2023/24 audit findings AR presented the summary of the Azets LLP 2023/24 audit findings against the requirements. He reported that Azets issued an unmodified audit opinion on the 2023/24 accounts. There were no adjustments made to the draft accounts which impacted on the financial position as reported. There was one material adjustment to the balance sheet; to bring in valuation of surplus land at £2.25m as planning consent was granted in 2023/24.
	AR reported that Azets did not identify any significant weaknesses in the Trust's value for money arrangements including for governance, economy, efficiency and effectiveness and financial sustainability.
