A day in the life of a Governor...my experience of volunteering on the reception desk.

A few months ago, I had the pleasure of doing an afternoon session on the main hospital reception desk with volunteer Susie. Due to my lack of knowledge of the layout of the hospital, I was rather daunted by the prospect. However, Susie's wealth of knowledge was very helpful, and she made me feel I could be useful. Susie demonstrated how her friendly, proactive and empathetic manner could help our patients and visitors. While I was there, one patient returned to thank Susie for her help the previous week. Another patient with a heavily bandaged arm asked to see the Chief Executive to thank her for such a wonderful hospital!

My first task was to accompany a visitor in her car to the Discharge Lounge. She had been very concerned as she was late to collect her friend and I hope this took away some of her stress on the day.

I had a most enjoyable two-hour session meeting patients and seeing them safely on their way. I felt reassured that visitors are well supported when they ask for help at the main reception desk, hopefully leading to a less stressful and positive visit to the hospital. The reception handled 73 enquiries in two hours, all successfully resolved. All in a day's work for our outstanding volunteers.

John attended this group in November 2025 as part of governors reaching out to patient groups.

The group is open to any adult over the age of 16 who has experienced a burn, or is a relative of someone who has experienced a burn of any type and any size at any age and have been treated at any hospital (not just QVH).

About 20 people attended the group and all were extremely complimentary about the treatment they had received at QVH. They thought the staff were outstanding and couldn't do enough to help them.

QVH Strategic Partnership

At the public Board Meeting on 16 December 2025, the Board approved the recommendation to enter into a strategic partnership with Royal Surrey NHS Foundation Trust and Ashford and St Peters NHS Foundation Trust (RSASP). This decision was supported by the Council of Governors at its meeting on the same day.

Happy 90th Birthday to QVH

8 January 2026 marked the 90th birthday of our current hospital site, officially opened on that day in 1936! The opening ceremony was performed by her Highness Princess Helena Victoria, with many a high-profile guests in attendance, including the Sackville Choir to sing a hymn! Local people from East Grinstead gathered to watch the official opening and then tour the hospital, with patients being transferred from our old hospital site 6 days later.

The image below shows what is now our Jubilee Building in all its glory, dating from that very year of opening. Jubilee previously housed 36 beds and accommodation for nurses and the matron. Today, it is home to our Sleep Disorder Centre, Minor Injuries Unit and Trust offices. Expansion of the hospital followed with the construction and opening of Canadian Wing in 1944, and further wards into the 1950s.
